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

# What can I do around the exterior of my home to be ready?

- Clean out roof gutters, downspouts, and check storm drains
  - Make sure downspouts are directed away from your foundation
- Secure fences and outdoor furniture
- Clear and remove dead tree limbs and branches
- Make sure windows and doors are closed properly
  - Consider boarding or taping windows if high damaging winds are expected.

# What's the difference between a Watch and Warning?

# FLOOD WARNING

A Flood Warning is issued when flooding is **happening** or will happen soon. Some roads will be **flooded**.

Move to higher ground. Never drive through flooded roads.

# FLOOD WATCH

A Flood Watch is issued when flooding is possible.

Stay tuned to radio/TV, follow weather.gov and be ready to seek higher ground.

# **Understand your Insurance Policies**

It's critical to read and understand your insurance policies.



### Homeowner's

Insurance

If wind blows off your roof or windows and water intrudes, your homeowner's policy will generally cover this as "wind damage" If water rises into your house from the ground level, that is generally covered only under flood insurance as "water damage"

# **Additional Flood Protection**



#### **INVEST IN FLOOD INSURANCE**

**DIY:** Did you know an inch of water can cause **\$25,000 in damage?** Talk to your agent about coverage options to adequately insure your home.



#### SEAL FOUNDATION CRACKS

DIY: Use mortar and masonry caulk to fill foundation cracks to help keep water out.



#### **INSTALL A SUMP PUMP & BACK FLOW VALVE**

**DIY:** Make sure you have a sump pump with **battery-operated backup in case of electrical failure**, and consider hiring a plumber to install a back flow valve, to push the flow of water & sewer backup away from your home.



#### **ELEVATE UTILITIES**

**DIY:** Raise and anchor air conditioning condensers, heat pumps, water meters and other service equipment onto platforms **at least 1 foot above the potential flood elevation**. Consider raising other major appliances above the ground floor to push the flow of water & sewer backup away from your home.




#### LANDSCAPE TO IMPROVE RUNOFF

**DIY:** Build up any sunken areas around the foundation, dig small depressions to properly channel water, and otherwise improve your yard so it **slopes away from your home**.

## How can I receive Weather Warnings?


Creating an account gives you the ability to add or edit your contact information and notification preferences at your convenience. You may also further customize the types of notifications you receive and add an additional address.


### Should I drive through flood waters?





# **GENERATOR SAFETY DONOT** place inside of **ANY** structure **DO NOT** place near open windows or doors **DO NOT** use in wet conditions **DO NOT** refuel when hot **DO NOT** use a wall outlet

### What should I do after Severe Weather?







Your home may be contaminated with mold or sewage–wear rubber boots, rubber gloves, and goggles during cleanup.



Make sure the electricity and gas are shut off to avoid fire or getting hurt. Have an electrician check the house before turning the power back on.

> > Contact your insurance agent as soon as possible to talk through your options.
