
What Lives in an

Thousands of species of birds, mammals, fish, and other wildlife depend on estuaries as places to live, feed, and reproduce. Waterfowl stop to rest and feed in estuaries during their long migrations. Much of the seafood we eat, including shrimp, oysters, and striped bass, depend on estuaries at some time during their lives. Because so many marine species rely on the sheltered waters of estuaries for their young, estuaries are often called "nurseries". (NH Fish & Game, 2016)

PRIZES


